



SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

MIDNIGHT RALLY
October 30/31, 2004

Round 5 of the 2004 BC TSD Rally Championship
and
Round 3 of the 2004 Island Rally Series

Presented by the Island Rallysport Club

The 2004 Midnight Rally is a one evening time-speed-distance (TSD) event, round 5 of the BC TSD Rally Championship and round 3 of the Island Rally Series. Midnight is organized by the Island Rallysport Club; and sanctioned by Rally Pacific Motorsports and Canadian Association of Rallysport. Interesting and challenging roads in the rugged central Vancouver Island area are used.

The 2004 BC TSD Rally Regulations will apply. These regulations are available from Rally Pacific Motorsports on-line at http://www.rallybc.com/html/regional_rules.htm or from the registrar of this event.

The rally starts in Courtenay, BC and finishes in Nanaimo, BC. It runs on straight forward instructions listed in a route book given to competitors prior to the scheduled departure time of the first car; and is approximately 400 km in length using roads about 60% gravel and 40% pavement. Maximum distance between gas stops is less than 250 km (156 miles). Distances and average speeds are given in metric and imperial units.

Definition: A competitor, for the purposes of these Supplementary Regulations, is two people, a driver and a navigator, and an eligible vehicle licenced and insured for driving on public roads. A competitor is also known as a crew.

REQUIRED EQUIPMENT:

- one self-supporting reflective warning triangle (min 30 cm per side)
- one 5 BC fire extinguisher
- basic first aid kit
- open cars require a roll bar

RECOMMENDED EQUIPMENT:

- map light
- clip board, pen, accurate digital timepiece
- driving lights (strongly recommended)

Note: if auxiliary driving lights are mounted, it must be possible to turn them off with one switch leaving only the standard low beams operating.

FORMAT OF THE RALLY and TIMING/SCORING

The rally is divided into a number of legs, each leg ending with a gas stop. Each leg is further divided into Transit sections and Regularity sections.

Transit sections are used to direct competitors to and between Regularity sections. Times given are adequate for completing the Transit sections well within the posted speed limits. **THERE ARE NO TIMING CONTROLS WITHIN TRANSIT SECTIONS.**

TIMING CONTROLS ARE WITHIN REGULARITY SECTIONS ONLY. The route book gives average speeds, which are below posted speed limits, and which must be maintained throughout each part of each Regularity section. Procedure when approaching a timing control is simply to drive straight past without stopping. The control official will record the time of passing to the nearest second. Timing controls will not be placed within 200 meters of stop signs or controlled intersections.

Times recorded to the nearest second at these controls determine the score. There is a one second penalty free interval each side of perfect time. A penalty of one point per second early or late is assessed at each control after the one second penalty free interval is exceeded. For double checking results, competitors may wish to note their time and mileage at each control but this is not required. At the finish, scores are totaled and the lowest score wins.

The maximum penalty at each control is 300 points (5 minutes early or late). The maximum penalty during each Regularity section is 600 points (10 minutes). Control officials remain in place at least 5 minutes after the scheduled arrival time of the last car. Ties are broken by the most zero scores, then the most 1 second penalties, etc.

EXCEPTIONS TO SCORING: A competitor coming upon an accident is required to stop and render aid if necessary (in case of injury for example). In such cases, the competitor should record the distance travelled into the section and the times of stopping and restarting. This information is to be given as a written declaration to a rally official or the event Steward. Scoring adjustments will be made in such cases, and the competitor should not try to regain the time lost until a sufficiently long break (such as a gas stop) is available. Declarations of time lost will also be considered for organizer errors which make official time unattainable; and other discretionary safety concerns.

AWARDS AND PRIZES: Prizes are awarded for first, second and third overall positions; and for the first placing crew in each of the following classes:

- Novice** Neither crew member having entered more than 3 TSD rallies before the current year; navigation equipment limited to Calculator Class.
- Paper** No calculators, rally tables or accessory odometers.
- Calculator** Accessory odometers; non-programmable calculating devices that are not driven by a wheel.
- Unlimited** Unlimited equipment
- Historic** Vehicles manufactured before December 31, 1973, as per the date stated on the vehicle registration; navigation equipment limited to Calculator Class.

For the purposes of event awards, the organizers reserve the right to reclassify an entry if there is only one vehicle entered in a class. However, scoring for the BC TSD Rally Championship is by the class entered.

MISCELLANEOUS:

Written permission of the owner of each vehicle entered is required for use of the vehicle in this rally.

In the case where a competitor is stranded, but not injured or in any danger, rally traffic should be waved past; and the crew should wait for assistance from the sweep vehicle. For more information, see Appendix C of the BC TSD Rally Regulations.

Note to Competitors and Volunteers: Change from daylight savings to standard time occurs at 2:00 am October 31. Although rally time will not be affected by the change, the time the first ferry leaves Duke Point for Tsawwassen will be 515 am Pacific Standard Time.
